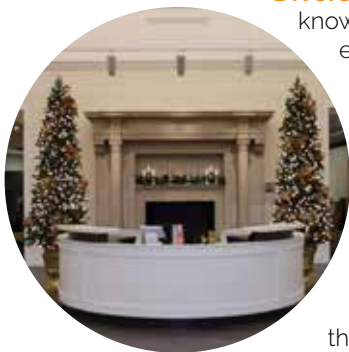
THURSDAY, NOV 21 | 7 PM

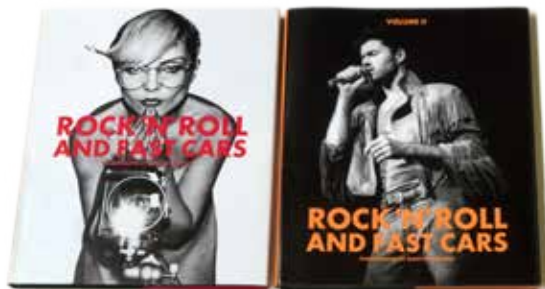
ROCK 'N' ROLL AND FAST CARS

October 17, 2019 – February 2, 2020

Rock 'n' Roll and Fast Cars opens at the Haggin Museum on October 17, 2019 and will run through February 2, 2020. This exhibition, on display in the New Gallery, will feature over 30 images selected from UK-based photographer Martyn Goddard's archives and includes photographs of iconic musicians, various automobiles, and super cars.

Martyn Goddard studied photography at Harrow College of Art and after graduating in 1974, he assisted various leading photographers before going freelance. He became part of the New Wave music scene of the 1970s, working with acts such as Blondie, The Jam and The Cure. His successful portrait career led him on a path to photographing some of the great artists and personalities of the time. As a freelance photographer, Goddard worked with a number of magazines, including *CAR*, *AUTOMOBILE*, and *OCTANE*. This allowed him to work on wide ranging automotive and travel stories from shoots with the Ralph Lauren collection to road trips around the world.

An opening reception will take place on Thursday, October 17, 2019 at 6:30 pm. Enjoy a glass of wine and snacks as you view the exhibition. Beginning at 7 pm Martyn Goddard will present a Gallery Talk about his two passions—rock 'n' roll and fast cars and how they shaped his career as a photographer, and what inspired this show.



After viewing the exhibit, visitors will have the chance to take home two beautifully-composed books pairing images of some of the most iconic musicians and automobiles of the era. Coinciding with the exhibition the Museum Store will have both volumes of Martyn Goddard's book, *Rock 'n' Roll and Fast Cars* (pictured to the left) available for purchase. Along with stunning photographs, each book includes anecdotes and articles that give insight into Goddard's photographic career.

REALISM AND HYPERREALISM IN CONTEMPORARY AUTOMOBILE AND MOTORCYCLE PAINTING

Throughout the 20th and 21st centuries, cars and motorcycles have not only been ubiquitous on the nation's streets and highways, but also in film, top forty hits, and in painting. With the emergence of photo-realism in the 1960's, motor vehicles assumed a special place of distinction as subject matter in the iconography of American art.

Luster: Realism and Hyperrealism in Contemporary Automobile and Motorcycle Painting, is a traveling museum exhibition comprised of over 45 paintings by nearly 15 of today's realists and hyperrealists who specialize in automobiles and motorcycles as their primary subject of choice. This exhibition will run from November 7, 2019 to February 2, 2020 at the Haggin Museum.



Luster encompasses a broad range of cars and motorcycles from vintage vehicles circa the 1940's and before to more recent classics. During the post-

World War II boom years, cheap gas and the advent of the Interstate Highway System in 1956 propelled automotive design and sales. In the 1950s, the industry reached new heights by offering consumers increased horse power for thrust and speed, and more artfully integrated design which was dramatized in the 1960's with features such as tail fins. *Luster* features paintings of passenger automobiles from those boom years and since, plus a range of motorcycles and racing vehicles.

Like the shiny automobiles and motorcycles portrayed by the exhibit's artists, its paintings can be characterized by the luster that permeates their imagery. Chrome

ornamentation and trim together with enameled bodywork, glass, and interior fabrication meet the needs of purpose-built vehicles of all sorts; these are the surfaces which recent realists and hyperrealists have exploited to generate true, virtuosic masterpieces.

FEELING NESS-STALGIC: *Three Generations of Ness*



As a worldwide leader in product design and distribution, Arlen Ness Enterprises is the only family-run business in the custom motorcycle industry that features builds by three generations of passionate designers—

Arlen, Corey, and Zach Ness. Their love of creating custom choppers and new products for motorcycles shaped the custom bike industry into what it is today. Sturgis Motorcycle Museum and Hall of Fame Executive Director Myrick Robbins has called Arlen "... the 'Godfather' of the custom bike movement. No one has done more to influence the look of what a custom motorcycle is."

The Haggin is honored to partner with Arlen Ness Enterprises to showcase a custom bike designed by each of the three-generations of the Ness family during the run of our upcoming exhibition *Luster: Realism and Hyperrealism in Contemporary Automobile and Motorcycle Painting*. The featured bikes will be: Arlen Ness' last build and last bike he rode called "Old School" (pictured below), Cory's build named "Cory's Little Indian," and a 145 cubic inch Chopper designed and built by Zach.

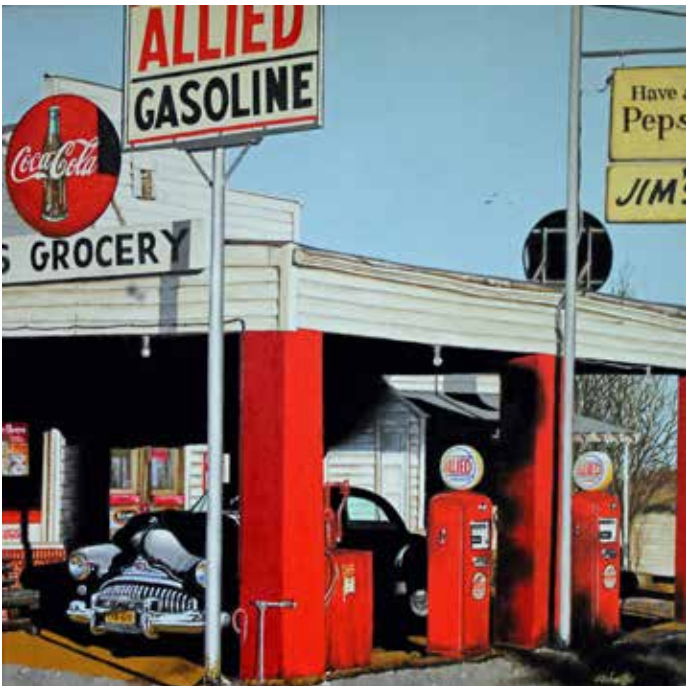

The first major reassessment of the artist James Tissot's career in over twenty years debuts this winter at the Legion. The Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco and the Musées d'Orsay et de l'Orangerie, Paris are co-organizing this international retrospective which examines approximately 60 paintings, with additional works on paper and cloisonné enamels by Tissot. New scholarship on the artist presented in this collaboration demonstrates that even Tissot's most ebullient society paintings reveal rich and complex commentary on topics such as nineteenth-century society, religion, fashion and politics, rendering him an artist worthy of reexamination in the twenty-first century.
