

Join us on Saturday, February 15th, 2025, from 2-3 p.m. as we welcome Stockton Soul, an ensemble that celebrates the rich legacy of Black American Music. Inspired by the soul orchestra sound of Motown legends like Curtis Mayfield and Isaac Hayes, Stockton Soul blends violin and cello performances with the rhythms and emotions of Black American Music, creating a vibrant and educational experience. Their performances connect audiences to the cultural significance of this music and its deep ties to American history, encouraging students to embrace their musical preferences and pursue careers in the arts.



Using music, lyrics, and personal stories, the ensemble tackles issues such as addiction, bullying, and trauma while fostering meaningful conversations about mental health. EXHIBIT READS

Join us as we investigate Dr. Stephanie Brown's The Case of the Disappearing Gauguin: A Study of Authenticity and the Art Market. This compelling book unravels the mystery of *Flowers and Fruit*, a painting long attributed to Paul Gauguin and treasured by the Haggin Museum.

Dr. Brown takes readers on a fascinating journey through newly discovered archives, tracing the painting's history from its debut in Paris and New York to its rediscovery in Stockton in 2018. Readers will grapple with questions of authenticity, value, and the intricate dynamics of the art market.



This book complements the ongoing exhibit, The Case of the Disappearing Gauguin, on view through April 6th, 2025. On Saturday, March 29th, from 1:30 to 3:00 p.m., join us for a special Exhibit Reads gathering featuring a discussion with Dr. Stephanie Brown, an interactive art mystery activity, and a reveal of the exhibit's visitor votes.

Examine "letters and correspondence," hidden clues, and inventory records to form your own theory about the painting's authenticity. Then, discover which evidence—provenance, connoisseurship, or scientific analysis—visitors find most convincing as we tally the votes and discuss the results.

94TH ANNUAL ROBERT T. McKEE STUDENT ART EXHIBITION

February 13 - March 16, 2025

elebrate the arts in education during the 94th Robert T. McKee Student Art Contest & Exhibition—the longest museum sponsored student art exhibition in the country! This event features the work of student artists from kindergarten through grade 12.

The exhibition was first envisioned by founding patron Robert T. McKee, whose goal was to encourage students by providing a public venue for their artwork. All schools in San Joaquin County—public, private, charter, parochial and home-schools—receive invitations to submit their work. Last year, Haggin received nearly 1,000 pieces of art chosen by the teachers as the best in their class. The temporary galleries will be filled with two- and three-dimensional art works created in crayon, colored pencil, pastel, watercolor, oil and acrylic paint, photography, and other mediums.

This year the museum will hold an artists' reception for students, their families, and teachers on March 1. This event is **FREE** to everyone and sponsored by the Junior Women's Group of the Haggin Museum who will provide punch and cookies to the guests.

DEPARTMENT OF MUSEUM TRAVEL

2024 WRAP UP & A LOOK AHEAD

2024 saw the Haggin Museum's Department of Museum Travel ramping up its menu of travel options. In May, travelers enjoyed a Placer County Daytripper which included some history of Placer County and Old Town Auburn and a visit to High-Hand Nursery. DMT visited Angel Island Immigration Station in September and a capacity group ferried across to the island on the Tiburon Ferry. The travelers enjoyed a fascinating docent-led tour of the Detention Barracks and were able to explore on their own the outdoor exhibits and the recently restored hospital building, which is now a museum. In addition, they viewed a new permanent exhibit about the little-known incarceration of Japanese Americans on Angel Island during World War II. In October the group traveled to Golden Gate Park and de Young museum. DMT and its guests experienced a docent-led private tour of the impressive Osher American Art exhibit at the de Young as well as explored the nearby attractions which included the Japanese Tea Garden, Botanical Garden and California Academy of Sciences.
